# **About This Project and Document**

This project is a direct result of the desire of a few members of the SOLT (Soroptimist Orientation Leadership and Training) Committee to have accumulated in one place the most accurate and **complete history** of the Vacaville Soroptimist Club. As we moved as a club into the new Millennium, we felt it was timely to look to the past as we set a new direction.

The 40 year story of the club resides in the memories of its members and in its documents. A precious few of the charter members remain with stories of the early days and many of this year's thirty-four active members knew only bits of the history. **Personal accounts** of events were collected through interviews and added to the History Map. The lore and traditions of the club exist in these stories - and the telling and hearing of them were delightful and heart warming.

The club's **documented history** was found in meeting minutes, financial reports, SoroptiBits newsletters, Past President scrapbooks and miscellaneous files and news clippings. Stored in boxes and various locations, these documents (some fragile and disintegrating) we gathered together in January, 2000, and became the major source of information to create the history map.

Like archaeologists at a site, this "dig" through the past sifted the information and organized it into **six major categories** by each President's term. These categories include:

- \*Programs of Service, Events and Projects
- \* Fund Raisers
- \*Awards and Recognition Given
- \*Membership Total and Active
- \* Key Changes, Issues or Challenges for the Club
- \*International / Federation Projects

Over a period of seven months, four versions of the History Map were created as more and more layers of information on Post-its accumulated from documents and interviews in each of the decades.

This **fourth version** represents the best information available. In some cases, complete years of information were missing and some types of information were missing. Blank space on the history map indicates these **gaps** in available information. In most cases, only major service projects, programs and donations (above \$500) were added to the history map.

This document is **organized by decade** - the 1960's, the 1970's, the 1980's and the 1990's. Each decade is is portrayed on a fold-out page. Items on this history matrix are identified by a **graphic icon and title**. Items that repeat over several years have the same icon making it essayer to find specific information and trends in information over the years. Each decade fold-out page is followed by a brief text summary. We hope the Board and Committees will spend time looking at and discussing the trends and patterns in this information and identifying implications for the future.

We wish to **thank everyone** who assisted in this project. A special thank you is extended to Tara Baumann, Stephanie Corrington, Lola DeVan, Corinne Grunion, Jill Hunter, and Wendy Wasserman for time spent assisting in documenting historical facts.

Soroptimist International has approximately 1000,000 members in 110 countries. The **mission** of Soroptimist is "Making a Difference for Women" globally and in our local communities.

# Notes: Revised History, June, 2013

As the years have passed, this wonderful club history has fallen out of use. At some point, the document was no longer copied and given to new members, so our history is again in danger of being lost. Recently, several new members have expressed interest in what we do and have done in the past. As I am the current member of longest standing, I volunteered to update the history. A series of meetings were held with the Presidents since 2000, each bringing their scrapbook or any other documentation available. All the Past Presidents were urged to contribute any additional information they had which was not included in the previous history.

In the last 13 years, computer science has made it possible to update the information in a manner that is more easily accessible. Seeing no reason to change the basic format of Suzanne's work, I used Adobe InDesign to set up a new spreadsheet and icons, first incorporating the gleaned history since 2000, and then transferring the old history into the document. Since few Presidents' had information on active vs. total members, that category was changed to a simple "Members". Memories have been jogged and more past events were incorporated, as well as clarifications of some of the history. For ease in reading, the visual format was changed to a vertical page with only 5 years of history per page. As you can see, there is more information available in the later years, hence a need for more space.

My hope is that each new President in turn, using the same categories as the master document, will write down the salient events of their year, to be incorporated into the History and thus, kept up to date. The computer file is to be stored among several members so any one of them can update the file yearly, with the last page reprinted periodically and new members receiving an undated document.

The Vacaville Soroptimist Club was chartered on August 20, 1960 with 25 members. The first several years were spent organizing as a club and fundraising. The Saturday Club was their meeting place until 1965 when they moved to the Nut Tree Restaurant. Donations to the community came in many forms during the 60's with the intention of improving the quality of life for women and children.

Some of the help provided to **schools** included a yellow station wagon for Gomer School's new preschool handicapped class, a television and antenna for Larson School, a set of encyclopedias to the Sierra Children's Home, an electric sewing machine for a class of retarded children, donating drill team uniforms to the high school, a mimeograph machine for Special Education, help with the high school science fair, and new school bus signs to increase safety on Gibson Canyon Road

The **larger community** received help with remodeling the Art League building and supporting nonprofit classes, the ambulance fund, the Fireman's Christmas baskets, remodeling the Senior Center building, a drinking fountain and trees for Andrews Park, a hair dryer for the County Hospital, lap robes for amputees at Oak Knoll Hospital, and sewing machine and cloth to a CMF inmate to make clothes for needy children.

**Youth** was the primary focus of Federation who instituted the S Club and Venture Club and awards for youth (YCA). The club assumed this focus in 1967 by starting a local "S" Club at Vacaville High School with 40 charter members. Venture started locally in 1968. Much of the club's effort in the lat e 60's was focused on forming and supporting the development and growth of these clubs. The club also sponsored a Korean orphan for four years and gave a 3 year scholarship to a 4H student in Korea. Scholarships were offered locally from the first year of the club and continue through today.

A Spring House Tour and Tea was the primary **fundraising** source from 1960 to 1968. However the club also sponsored a "Wig-O-Rama", a fashion show, a "fish" pond at Fiesta Days, and raffled off Thanksgiving turkey dinners.

The club started with 25 charter **members** in 1960 and finished in 1970 with 23 active members. This small group of dedicated women prided themselves on service; donating 2,550 hours of service in 1962/1963 and 2,469 hours in 1964/5. The club also entered into the spirit of the local May Fiesta Days celebration by entering a float or decorated car into the parade annually.

The second decade of the Club focused not only on women and youth but also responded to the national and **political forces** of the Viet Nam War. In 1970, the local S Club and Venture Club combined with us to bake 150 dozen cookies to send to soldiers in Southeast Asia. The club launched a 20 week letter writing campaign on behalf of MIA's and POW's. We also reached globally in 1971 to help with world hunger sending two pregnant goats to Korea to help women with Food Programs.

Programs and projects for **Youth** in the 70's included donating lighting for the Vacaville High School football field, providing play equipment and supplying games to the Children's Center, and donating adaptive physical education equipment to the Recreation Department for the handicap program. The club also lobbied for and purchased "Bike Way" signs that spurred the City Council into beginning a bike trail system. We donated a bicycle to the police department for use in safety courses. We sent a 4-H girl to Washington, DC for a course on Citizenship and sponsored an American Indian girl from 1973-75 through the IGE program. Scholarships and the Youth Citizenship Award continued annually. In 1978, we held the first Youth Recognition Night which continues to today.

Some of our **local community** programs included buying a study desk and a new slide projector for the Vacaville library, putting a railing on the steps of the Chamber of Commerce building, donating a Braille typewriter so that Vacaville volunteers could make tapes for the blind, buying an air conditioner for the Art League, supporting the "Save Our Trees" campaign with Parks and Recreation, and the "Vial of Life" Hurst Rescue Tool for the community, helped the "Meals on Wheels" program get established and donated blood to the local blood bank. In 1973, we held our first Christmas event for the Winsor House Convalescent Home, a tradition that continues to today.

For **Women**, new awards were created. In 1972, the Training Award Program (TAP) was started in Federation to help local women with training toward reentry into the labor market. It's now know as the Women's Opportunity Award and has been offered by our club snide the 70's. In 1978 Lela Watkins was our first honoree as "the Woman of the Year" which evolved in later decades into the "Women of Distinction" and "Women Helping Women" awards.

**Fundraising** during the 70's included flea markets, raffles for gourmet dinners, See's candy sales, a Dickens Christmas Faire, selling 503 copies of the book "Vacaville: Heritage of a California Community", and in 1980 selling 1300 pounds of Alaska fish!

This decade saw an explosion of activity and programs as membership grew. The focus on **Women** included support for the Battered Women's Project and providing the Women's Shelter with a washing machine, chest, sofa and sleeping bags. In 1984, we began to sponsor Legislative Workshops on Women's Issues that continued until 1998. We supported the Rape Crisis Center. We also supported an exhibit at the Vacaville Museum on the "History of Women in Solano County." In 1985, our "women of Distinction" award started and in 1982, "Women Helping Women."

We supported **Youth** with programs and projects that included organizing Youth seminars, helped with Vacaville High School Theater renovation, the Christian Children's Fund, Mark's Farm and Growing Center for Handicapped Children, a 5 year sponsorship of a young Indian girl, donate dot Child Haven, bought a ResucusiBaby and LifeLine trainer for Solano College, helped with the "children's Finger Printing Project", and contributed to the Quest Program that builds skills for adolescents.

Programs and projects that supported the **larger community** took off in a very personal way in 1982 with the death of club member, Kay Hayden, of cancer. The need for a Hospice program in Vacaville was obvious and the club spearheaded and helped develop the local Hospice program from 1982 to 1984. We also provided smoke detectors for senior citizens, helped start white paper recycling in offices, served on the United Way Telethon, provided a television for Autumn Leaves (Senior Apartments), a slide projector for the Police Department, and nursing equipment for the Nursing program at Solano College. We also became a funder for the Vacaville Museum for doors and exhibits.

**Fundraising** centered on two primary strategies: the Lobster Dinner and Dance and a booth at the Onion Festival for beverages, wine and souvenirs. Additionally, we sold See's candy, had a wine and cheese fashion show, and in 1990 had a first Make-a-Wish Dinner and Dance.

Club **membership** peaked in 1984 with 82 members / 72 active members and ending the year with 63 member / 50 active members. Retention was a prominent issue for the club as well as recruiting. In 1989, some club members went on television on Vaca View Channel 8 to spread the word about Soroptimist. In 1988, smoking was a challenging issue for the club. We also held some joint functions with other service clubs in Vacaville. For the 1988 Regional Conference in Santa Rosa, our club made costumes and wrote a play entitled "Foul Play in the Farm Yard" which is still talked about today!

In the 1990's we supported **Women** through the Women's Family Center, mediation services, the Rape Crisis Center, and the Homeless Shelter. The "Women of Distinction" and "Women Helping Women" awards continued.

Focus on **Youth** included a 4 year \$20,000 project to support the Children's Reading Room in the Vacaville Public Library, helping needy kids with back-to-school clothes with the "Shopping Spree Program" at Melvyn's, Mark's Farm and Growing Center for Handicapped Children, helped start the North Bay Hospice Children's Bereavement Group, wrapped presents for leukemia outpatients at UC Davis and Sutter, supporting the Horseback Riding Therapy Program for Handicapped Students, donating air conditioners for Willis Jepson Intermediate School, and supporting PAL curriculum materials for literacy. Youth Recognition Night continued as well as Youth Citizenship Awards and Scholarships.

We supported the **larger community** in ways that included support for Canine Companions for Independence, installing our new communication kiosk in Alamo Park, supporting Hospice, donating trees for the new Cultural Center, participating in the United Way telethon, and decorating Christmas trees for the Festival of Trees. We helped with The Giving Tree program, provided a donation for "Fish" (the local food bank), invested in the Harbison House Project and donated to the Vacaville Museum. In 2000, we created and installed a "Place of Peace" plaque in an area of the new Creek Walk and made and distributed "Place of Peace" pins.

**Fundraising** in the 90's included the "Make-a-Wish" Dinner and Dance, booths at the Onion Festival, golf tournaments, See's candy sales, Aluminum can recycling at Fiesta Days, flea markets and sold tickets to an evening of shopping at Westfield Mall. Fundraising was given a boot in 1992 with a grant from the Buck Foundation (\$20,000).

The **membership** in the club in 1990 was 59+ member / 43 active and ended in 2000 with 52 members / 34 active. This drop in membership is a concern and recruitment and retention an issue for programs. We offered Laurel Society Memberships to Lola DeVan and Mae Azevedo. A Friendship Link was established with a club in Rome Italy, but the Link with Cleveland, England was lost due to the closure of their club. With the close of the Nut Tree in 1995, the club moved finally into the Opera House.

**Women** were helped by our Domestic Violence programs through the decade, as well as participation in Women to Women International, Relay for Life and our Women's Opportunity Award generous grant. Local outstanding women were recognized for their public service through the new Ruby Award, formerly the Woman of Distinction or Women Helping Women Award.

Our Service to **Youth** included our usual generous scholarships and awards, the increase of the number of S Clubs from one at Vaca High, to 3 or 4, established Becca's Closet at Will C Wood High (gently used prom dresses are given to students), a Reading Program at the Library and TGIF (ending with TGIF only) where members read stories to youngsters, completed the Library Mural Project which financed a historical mural complete with Soroptimist logo in the Town Square Library, the popular Mervyn's Back to School Shopping Spree, donations to Baskets of Hope underprivileged children, Christmas Wish, and large contributions to VPEF.

The larger **community** was served with our annual Christmas party at Winsor House and Vacaville Healthcare, maintenance of Place of Peace, the Let's Cool It Global Warming Campaign, donations for disaster relief: Hurricane Katrina, Women @ Ground Zero, Gifts for overseas Women Troops; and ongoing support for Opportunity House.

The club participated in a detailed survey with the clear conclusion the members preferred one large, very successful **fund raiser** vs. many small ones, hence the rebirth of the new and vastly improved Lobster Dinner. This event morphed into a very fun themed event with silent auction, selling out each year, creating funding for our various Service Projects.

**Membership** remained stable, beginning with 45 members and ending the decade with 46 while meeting at the Opera House. The Rome Friendship Link continued through the decade, but was lost shortly after due to the death of the principal Rome Soroptimist member. A new link was established with Sakai, Japan towards the end of the decade. A new Soroptibits online newsletter was developed and continues on. Special club members were recognized through a donation in their name to the Federation Laurel Society or to Regional Fellowship.

The last 10 years brought us into the digital age. Our Newsletter, Soroptibits, formerly distributed to members via email, morphed into frequent postings on Facebook, showcasing our various speakers, special events, and even groups of members at various community events. Lunch reservations were required, and were made via the online website, MeetUp. As the decade was ending, the Covid-19 pandemic closed down our state and changed our lives; our weekly lunch meetings, committee meetings, awards dinner and Installation of Officers moved to a digital online platform, Zoom.

Our historical programs continued and grew: the annual Christmas parties at our convalescent / independent living centers grew to three facilities, while the number of S Clubs, grew to five, one at each of our various high schools. We added new programs to directly help women and girls: Dreammaker, selecting one graduate each month from the Solano County Jail's Women's Reentry Program, for a makeover, shopping for work clothing, and lunch; and STEPS, Soroptimist Training Empowerment for Personal Success, a biweekly lunch and life skills program for at risk-girls at Country High. Our scholarship program changed to a \$3000 / year grant, renewable for up to 3 years, plus added a new scholarship in memory of our beloved Mary Harris.

We continued to support local charities, such as Opportunity House, Boys and Girls Club, Solano County Library Foundation, American Legion Girls State, and others supporting at risk women. A major effort was made to publicize Sex Trafficking. This directly led to our participation to change State law mandating age appropriate learning in public schools. Our President, Beth Rowe, led a major fundraising drive to process 11 untested rape kits in Vacaville. This resulted in one arrest and Beth being named a Woman of the Year by Assemblyman Jim Frazier.

During the decade, we applauded three of our members and spouses named Grand Marshalls in the Vacaville Fiesta Days Parade: Wendy Wasserman and Jim Kellogg, Buff and Dave Fleming, and Carole Warren.


The annual Lobster Dinner and auction continued to sell out each year. The incredible success of this event funded our many programs and awards. The Pandemic moved the dinner online, resulting in less revenue. Over the years, our investment portfolio became quite healthy, but by the end of the decade, due to the pandemic, for the first time our reserves were accessed to help fund the 2020/21 year.

Membership remained stable, ending the decade with 46 members. Two Book Clubs formed and continue to meet regularly.

As the decade ends, and I write this in January 2021, the Pandemic has upended our lives. However, the club remains resilient, active, and optimistic for a return to normal for the 2021/22 Club Year.
